LOCATION

Prince George Aquatic Centre: 1770 George Paul Lane, Prince George, BC.

FACILITY

- Club tents/day camping permitted in designated areas on the east side of the facility: Saturday and Sunday. See Appendix 1. Please pack up and take all belongings at the end of each day.
- The 50 metre, 8 lane indoor pool will be in a 2 x 25 metre competition configuration. See Appendix 2.

CAMPING

Overnight, self-contained, camping is available in the parking lot directly west of the facility on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. See Appendix 1. Overnight Camping is at a cost of \$30/night payable to your club president. Permits will be issued to club presidents to distribute to their campers.

RACE FORMAT

- Preliminary Races will be seeded by division and gender. Where available, the registrar may combine heats.
- Final Races will be seeded by division and gender with the fastest 8 swimmers to qualify from the preliminary races. Final races will follow the same event schedule in the afternoon following the preliminaries.

RULES

All current BCSSA rules will apply to the 2024 Cariboo Regional Swim Meet including:

- Each swimmer may swim a maximum of 4 individual events and 2 relays
- Each swimmer must have competed in at least one individual event at one BCSSA meet
- Deck entries will NOT be permitted
- Late entries will NOT be permitted

RACE OFFICIATING

- The Regional Director of Officials (RDO) will oversee all officiating activities in relation to the competition. The RDO has the authority to designate an alternate Senior Official to oversee the officiating of the competition if required or desired.
- The RDO, or designate, will ensure all BCSSA Speed Swimming Rules are adhered to during the competition.
- The Speed Swimming Rules of the BC Summer Swimming Association (dated January 2024), as published on the BCSSA website (the "BCSSA Rules"), will apply. All rules of Stroke and Turn will be applied to all age groups except those swimmers ages 6 and under and/or registered as PUPS. - All participating clubs should supply at minimum, two-qualified officials or designate an official in training to shadow a qualified official during the competition.
- Lane timing will be completed by all five participating swim club's volunteer bases. Each
 club will be designated timing stations to man for the entire competition, each lane must
 provide 3 volunteers per lane (if this requirement cannot be met, the assigned club must
 notify the Meet Manager by the registration date). Lane assignments as follows:











Dawson Creek Seals: Lanes 1 and 2

Mackenzie Rainbows: Lane 3

Prince George Pisces: Lanes 4 and 5

Nechako Valley Otters: Lanes 6/7

Quesnel Sea Lions: Lanes 7/8

• All timers must be at their timing stations, ready for a pre-race briefing, training, and the timing system prerace tests at 8:00 am.

MARSHALLING

Marshalling will be announced within the building following the BCSSA policy regarding marshalling calls. All swimmers are encouraged to report to the clerk of the course in the marshalling area as they are called.

- Division 1-4 and O-Cat 1 individual heats and finals will be marshalled
- Division 5-8 and O-Cat 2 individual heats and finals will NOT be marshalled but encouraged to report to the clerk of the course
- All relays will be marshalled

ENTRIES

All entries are due to be submitted via email (registrar.pgpisces@gmail.com) by 10:00 pm on Tuesday, July 31, 2024. Entries must be submitted through Active Swim Manager to export the event file with all entries in the correct events. Please ensure the correct designations ("S" or "O"), gender, and BCSSA IDs are entered for each swimmer with verified birthdates.

QUALIFICATION FOR PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The top 3 finishers in the finals of each "S" and "O" individual event will qualify to swim at the Provincial Championships
- Swimmers attaining a Provincial Qualifying Time (PQT) in a finals race, who did not place in the top 3 positions will also qualify to swim at the Provincial Championships.

PROVINCIAL SIGN UP

- The BCSSA Provincial Swim Meet will take place on August 16-18, 2024, at the UBC pool in Vancouver, BC. Attendance at the Provincial Meet, as indicated above, is contingent on a swimmer qualifying according to the outlined criteria.
- All swimmers must notify their coach, preferably prior to the regional swim meet if they
 intend to swim at Provincial Championships. If a swimmer who places in the top 3 is not
 attending Provincials, the region can send the next fastest swimmer in their place.
 Please review the Provincial Championships requirements, commitments, and timelines
 with your coach prior to the Cariboo Region Provincial Qualifying Swim Meet.
- All decisions to swim at the Provincial Championships must be made by the end of the Cariboo Region - Provincial Qualifying Swim Meet as entries are sent to the provincial organizers immediately following the awards ceremony. The region would like to send a full roster of swimmers to this year's Provincial Championships.

PROVINCIAL PARENT MEETING

A parent meeting will be held on Saturday, August 3 at the start of afternoon warmups. Vital information about provincials will be discussed. This meeting will take place outside the pool in the grassy area to the right of the main doors.











PROVINCIAL COACHES MEETING

All coaches are required to meet with the Regional Director (and Meet Manager) at the end of the meet on Sunday to finalize the Provincial Entries and Scratches.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

This meeting is scheduled for August 3, 2024, after dinner. Everyone is welcome to attend.


